

SPECIAL NOTICE

On March 28, 1980, James Koshiba, Chairperson of the Judicial Selection Commission, was our guest speaker. Those women attorneys present expressed concern that since the creation of the Commission no women have yet been selected for judicial appointment.

Mr. Koshiba explained that nominees must be licensed to practice law in Hawaii for a period of not less than ten years preceding nominations, with the exception of nominees for the district court who must be licensed to practice for a period of not less than five years. Mr. Koshiba stated that the pool of qualified women attorneys is very small. Moreover, very few of those qualified actually applied. The Commission would like to identify additional candidates. HWL is supporting this effort by republishing the following notice which appeared in the Honolulu Star Bulletin on Feb. 28, 1980. Please contact the Commission if you are interested.

## NOTICE OF JUDICIAL VACANCIES

Pursuant to Rule 8B of the Judicial Selection Commission, notice is hereby given by the State of Hawaii Judicial Selection Commission that vacancies in the Hawaii Judiciary exist or are anticipated in the District and Circuit Courts, First Judicial Circuit, State of Hawaii.

All interested persons are hereby notified that the Judicial Selection Commission is now seeking and accepting nominations, of themselves or others, for such judicial offices. Pursuant to Article VI, section 3, of the Hawaii State Constitution, as amended November 1978, nominees for these judicial offices shall be residents and citizens of the State and of the United States and licensed to practice law by the Supreme Court for a period of not less than ten years preceding nominations, with the exception of nominees for the position of District Judges who must be licensed to practice for a period of not less than five years.

All nominations received by the Commission shall be kept confidential. Applications must be filed within ten (10) days of this notice. All applications and/or inquiries shall be addressed to:
