Hawaii Women Lawyers Survey. Yes, another copy of the survey is attached to all who have been attorneys prior to April 1, 1980. If you have not already returned one, please do so. If you have, thank you. We have extended the date for response to August 15, 1980. We have free computer time and several very experienced sociologists to assist us with the data processing. So far, 105 of the 245 questionnaires originally sent out have been returned, and our technical experts recommend a response rate of at least 50% with 75% (183) being even better. Please express your views on the practice of law, provide some basic demographic information about yourself, and help make this a better study of women attorneys in Hawaii. RESPOND IN TERMS OF YOUR STATUS DURING APRIL AND MAY, 1980. Please take the time today to complete the enclosed. Thank you. We will have preliminary data announced at the next meeting based on the responses received thus far. However, a written report of the survey will include all responses received through August 15th.
