Legislation. Since our last meeting, different members have been working on legislation HWL hopes to support or propose this session. Currently we are working on child care, compulsory continuation of insurance coverage for 30 days past divorce, and termination of parental rights in paternity suits. NOW Legal Defense And Education Fund. An information Clearinghouse containing national data on equal rights amendment litigation has been established. The Clearinghouse includes comprehensive information about legal cases filed under state equal rights amendments. Single copies of the Clearinghouse Index and order forms are available free of charge through December 31, 1980, from the Era Impact Clearinghouse, NOW Legal Defense and Education Fund, 132 West 43rd Street, 2nd Floor, New York, New York, 10036. There is a small charge to cover the charge of reproducing materials ordered from the index. Also forward any information about state ERA cases or questions about the project to the Clearinghouse, Attention Phyllis Segal, legal director. Hawaii is one of sixteen states with constitutional equal rights provisions. You can also make tax deductible contributions to the project.
