RE: Status of Pending Bills in the Legislature
Monitored by HWL

As of 3/10/83:

1. HB 20 (denying liquor licenses to applicants who discriminate) Charlene Norris testified before Judiciary and CPC Committees; re-referred; crossed over to Senate; died in Government Operations Committee.
SB 1211 (same) Died in Government Operations Committee.
2. HB 1160 (enforcement powers in cases of sexual harassment in employment) Re-referred; died in House Judiciary Committee.
3. HB 1035 (deleting sexual gratification from definition of sexual contact) Deferred until next year.
4. SB 911 (comparable worth study) Passed 1st reading in Senate; referred to Human Resources and died there.
5. HB 1025 (program for displaced homemakers) Passed 2nd reading in the House; died in Finance Committee.
- * 6. HB 1417 (child protective act--new definition of abuse) Faye Kimura testified 3/9 before Judiciary Committee; passed with amendments; passed 1st reading House; to calendar; crossed to Senate; referred to Senate Judiciary Committee.; will pass out to third reading.
- * 7. SB 627 (TRO enforcement) Linda Oliver testified; passed 1st reading; crossed over; now in House Judiciary Committee.

* HB 1037 (same) Crossed over to Senate; referred to Senate Judiciary Committee.; will pass out for third reading.
8. HR 17 (initiate study of permanent retirement program for elderly) Referred to Finance Committee.

HB 123 (same) Died in Human Services Committee.

HB 1228 (Ohana Housing for elderly) Referred out of Human Services Committee--Report #126; died in Finance Committee.

- SB 466 (program of leasing to elderly or handicapped)
Re-referred to HUD and died there.
9. HB 1005 (net estate rather than augmented estate for surviving spouse) Passed 1st reading in House; re-referred to House Judiciary Committee; heard in House on 3/10; held in Committee.
10. HB 608 (control of community property in either spouse) Passed 1st reading in Senate Judiciary Committee; re-referred; Carpenter waiting for additional info.
11. HB 890 (child passenger restraints) Passed 1st reading (House & Senate); referred to Senate Transportation Committee and House Transportation & Judiciary Committee.
- HB 570 (same) Re-referred to Transportation and Judiciary Committees.
- HB 150 (same) Re-referred to Transportation and Judiciary Committees.
- HR 64 (same) Referred to PEGO and Finance Committees.
12. SB 431 (prohibit DSSH funds for abortions) Referred to Human Resources Committee then to Ways & Means; held in Human Resources Committee.
13. SB 54 (relating to non-profit corporations) Referred to Consumer Protection Committee--substantial amendments being drafted; no re-hearing scheduled; held in committee this year.
- * 14. HR 68 (urging reaffirmation of ERA ratification) In House Judiciary Committee; no hearing scheduled yet.
15. SB 87 (raise drinking age to 21) Both referred to Senate Judiciary Committee; both House and Senate bills will probably die in Senate Jud. Committee.

16. HB 153 (continuing education program for women) Passed 1st reading in House; referred to WLH; no hearing scheduled; probably will die there.
17. HCR 93 (long-term care for elderly) Referred to Human Services in House.
