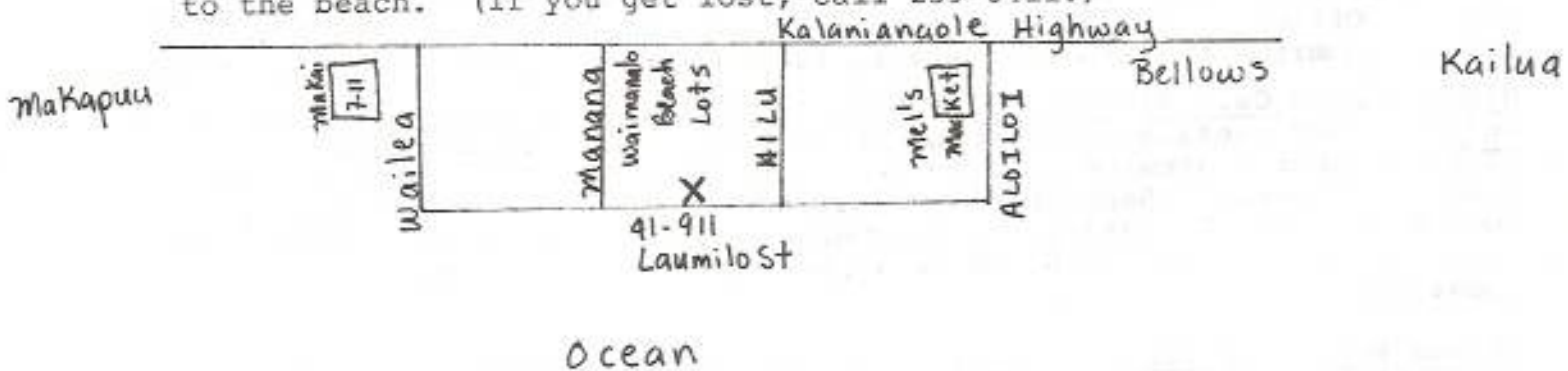

Status Report of the Legislative Committee: The legislative committee targeted two areas during the 1984 Legislative session: comparable worth and statutory compliance with ERA. The subcommittee on Comparable Worth (comprised of Sherry Broder, Dona L. Hanaike, Joyce Y. Neeley, Norma Titcomb, and Angie King) monitored bills on comparable worth, submitted written testimony, and lobbied with several legislators regarding this vital issue. This subcommittee maintained liasons with the Commission on the Status of Women and other women's groups with the help of Janice Kim.

The subcommittee on Statutory Compliance with ERA (comprised of Charlene Norris, Pamela Berman, Allison Jacobs-Pendragon, Jo Judy and Angie King) kept in contact with various women's organizations and monitored the legislative bills.

The Legislative Committee proposes to fund a law student intern for the fall semester. Her assignment will be to do research in various subject areas affecting women (i.e. comparable worth, child care) the end result being the drafting of legislation for the upcoming 1985 session.
