EQUALITY DAY - AUGUST 26, 1985

"Equality Day" commemorates the passage of the 19th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution which gave women the right to vote. In celebration of this day, the Hawaii State Commission on the Status of Women and the U.S. Coast Guard are co-sponsoring a special program at the Prince Jonah Kuhio Kalaniana'ole Federal Building, 300 Ala Moana Blvd. on August 26.

A noon-time program will include: Karen Keawehawai'i opening the ceremony; music by the Pacific Fleet Band; a tree planting of one of the "One Million Trees of Aloha" by Hawaii's First Lady Jean Ariyoshi; a keynote address by Representative Donna Ikeda, Hawaii's Presidential appointee as U.S. Delegate to the United Nations Conference on Women held in Nairobi, Kenya. Exhibits will also be displayed by various women's groups in the courtyard of the Federal Building.

EQUAL EMPLOYMENT LAW SEMINAR: SEPTEMBER 26 and 27

The U.S. Equal Employment Opportunity Commission, University of Hawaii and the Office of the Governor are co-sponsoring an EEO seminar on September 26 and 27, 1985 at the Ala Moana Americana Hotel.

Equal Employment Law experts from the public and private sectors and the academic community will discuss issues confronting the employee and employer in today's employment environment. Some of the issues which will be addressed include: sexual harassment, age discrimination, race discrimination, wage equity/comparable worth/equal pay, EEOC procedures with the Hawaii Department of Labor and Industrial Relations and the Office of Federal Contract Compliance Program, and EEOC's new individual relief policy.
