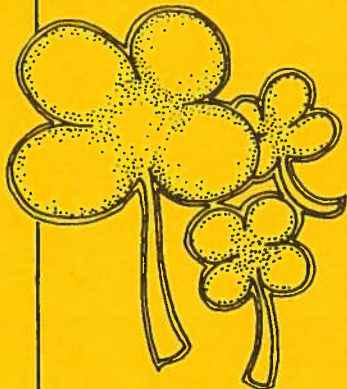

The film depicts interviews with women and their families and is narrated by Dr. Ker-neth Edelin who was indicted and eventually acquitted of manslaughter for performing abortions in Boston in the seventies.
