“Early Women Lawyers Of Hawaii”

The Hawaii Women Lawyers Foundation in conjunction with the Foundation for Hawaii Women's History is sponsoring a new project: the writing and publication of a book about the early women lawyers of Hawaii. The book will include familiar figures such as former Hawaii Supreme Court Justice Rhoda Lewis as well as less familiar pre-statehood attorneys who influenced their time. The book is still in its formative stages and will be of interest to women lawyers but also of general interest. When completed, the book will be offered to the Biographical Research Center at the University of Hawaii for their monograph series published in conjunction with the UH Press.

To start a fund for the costs of this project, The HWL Foundation is offering for sale **Notable Women of Hawaii**, a biographical reference work published in 1984 which documents the contribution of women to the history of the Islands. Edited by Barbara Bennett Peterson, Professor of History at Honolulu Community College, **Notable Women**, includes biographical sketches and photographs of 127 women representing a wide range of careers, economic, educational and ethnic backgrounds and offers role models for women of all ages.

Through the cooperation of the UH Press, **Notable Women** is being offered to The HWLF at the discount price of \$24.75 for a cloth covered volume. For each book sold, The HWL Foundation will earn \$8.25 of the discount price for its own book project which amount is tax-deductible. If you are located in downtown Honolulu, The HWLF can arrange for delivery to you. Otherwise an additional \$1.50 per book for shipping is required. The deadline for this offer is 10/31/86.
