Criteria: Individual in our community who has over her or his lifetime made significant contributions in areas that have advanced women in the legal community, influenced the future of the legal profession, and/or enhanced the status of women or promoted equal opportunities for all people.

Distinguished Service Award

Criteria: Individual in our community who has made significant community contributions within the past year which contributions advance women in the legal community, influence the future of the legal profession, and/or enhance the status of women or promote equal opportunities for all people.

Hawaii Woman Jurist of the Year

Criteria: Sitting Judge who has made significant contributions to the bench which contributions advance the mission of Hawai'i Women Lawyers of advancing women in the legal community, influencing the future of the legal profession, and/or enhancing the status of women or promoting equal opportunities for all people.

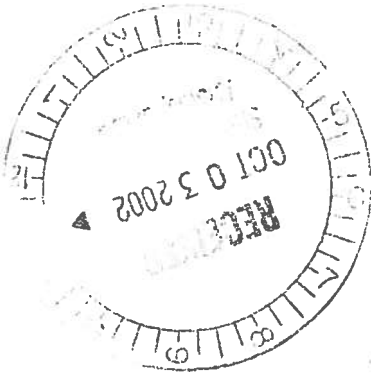
